From the EPA — Leaks can increase water bills

"Common water leaks around your home include worn toilet flappers, dripping faucets, and leaking shower heads—all of which can be fixed with a little do-it-yourself effort," said EPA Office of Wastewater Management Director Dr. Andrew Sawyers. "The average household's leaks can account for nearly 10,000 gallons of water wasted every year—the amount of water needed to wash 300 loads of laundry—and could be adding as much as 10% to your water bill."

Here are tips finding leaks and saving water:

- Check your water meter before and after a two-hour period when no water is being used. If the meter does not read exactly the same, there is probably a leak.
- Place a drop of food coloring in the tank at the back of the toilet. If color shows up in the bowl in 5 to 10 minutes, there's a leak; flush afterward to avoid staining the tank.
- If the rubber flapper in your toilet tank is more than five years old, replace it with a new one, as worn flappers can cause toilets to run or have silent leaks.
